




CUBAN MISSILE CRI

The USA was very concerned about the nuclear missiles that Khrushchev had placed in Cuba as such weapons could hit much of the eastern United States within minutes.



On October 28 Khrushchev gave in and informed Kennedy that the missiles already in Cuba would be returned to the USSR. In return, Kennedy promised that the United States would never invade Cuba.
