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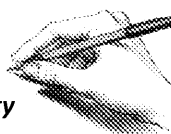
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Teacher's Introduction

This resource has been created as a supplement to the resource Practice Exam Meaning for A Level Spanish AQA.

This resource will enable students to identify the words we call 'false friends' the wrong words in translation, when sitting the translation section of the exam.

There is a selection of the most common 'false friends', which should be used on the practice worksheets provided. The use of both will give students the capacity to differentiate between various words and thus, select the correct word usage. Regardless of which specification is used, this resource has been carefully designed to improve their translation skills.

A key is provided to help teachers and students to mark their work.

How to Use the Resource

The resource includes 100 false friends and 10 worksheets. Each worksheet gives practice in both Spanish to English and English to Spanish translation.

The majority of words listed in this resource are purely false friends. However, some false friends, they can also have the same meaning in English. To avoid confusion, to indicate words, which **also** have the same meaning in English and Spanish.

Teachers could introduce 10 false friends per lesson. Various card games and translation exercises to reinforce students' understanding of false friends. To ensure plenty of practice and enjoyment.

Suggestions for games:

- **Match the Cards:** For groups of three or four students. Put all the cards face down. Students pick up two cards and if they match in both word and meaning, they will put them back, face down and another student will have a go. At the end of the game wins.
- **Snap:** Played in pairs, the cards are dealt into two piles and kept face down. On their turn, a player turns over the top card and places it in the middle of the table, face up. If the other player has a card that matches (word and meaning) the card on the top of the pile, that player takes the cards. Both players cover the cards with their hand. The player wins the pile and the game continues. The player with the most cards at the end of the game wins.
- **Guess the Meaning:** Teachers glue a selection of cards with the words and meanings on the back. All the cards are put on top of the table with the meanings facing down. A student chooses a card and then explains the meaning of the word. If the explanation is correct, the student keeps the card. If the explanation is wrong, they put the card back, facing up and the next player has a go.
- **Describe the Card:** Spread the cards with the meanings of the words facing down. Teachers/students then choose a card from a separate pile containing definitions to explain the meaning of the word to the group. The winner will be the student who gives the correct meaning from the table. The student with the most cards wins.
- **Dominoes:** Each card has a key word and a definition on it – students match the words to their definitions, creating a long line of cards in the correct order.

Once students demonstrate familiarity with the words teachers can set translation exercises in the classroom or as homework.
