MACBETH DEPOSED

The short reign of Macbeth was brought to a sudden end today in a surprise attack on Dunsinane Castle.

In the aftermath of the attack it has become clear that the recent spate of murders amongst the nobility in Scotland was instigated by Macbeth, who was driven by his own ambition to kill and to keep killing, regardless of the consequences.
