Introduction

Session One and Two

Exploration of the major characters in this play through the explorative skills of sculpting, - 'Role on the Wall', Still Image and Text.

Students will use a section of text and annotate it with their ideas for presentation of the characters.

Session Three

Students will explore the main themes in the play, using Still Image and Improvisation. The final improvisation is in the style of a documentary.

Students will start to take notes for the Response Phase.

Session Four

Characters are explored through the use of Status, through Improvisation and use of Script Extracts.

Status and Conflict are looked at as structural devices in a play through practical work and discussion related to the text.

Session Five and Six

Students explore the plot of the play and the climaxes. They use their knowledge to create a film trailer including the key events in the plot.

They use the explorative strategies of Role-play, Crosscutting, Narration and Forum Theatre to explore the back-story of the play and the issues within it.

Session Seven

Students work on a piece of text for performance. The Lesson Plan and Worksheets guide them to do this in a way that gets them to think carefully about their rehearsal techniques and the skills needed for a good performance of a piece of text.

Students are encouraged to start considering how they will write their Development Phase based on this work. Their practical work is videoed.

Session Eight

Looks at how students can evaluate a piece of practical work, using the video made in the previous session. It breaks down the evaluation into bite-sized chunks and encourages students to share ideas and good practice.
